He provided guidelines on font size, spacing, citations, and correctly framing research objectives.

The session was honored by the presence of renowned faculty members, including Dr. Preeti Bhatt, Prof. Manju Singh, Prof. Vibhuti Singh Shekhawat, Dr. Dipti Sharma, and Dr. Nidhi Bansal.
